



## Information Sheet 2-Pack v Laminate

Here's a comparison of these two popular cabinet finishes:

### **Durability and Longevity**

**2-Pack Paint** delivers exceptional durability with its chemically-cured polyurethane finish. It's highly resistant to chips, scratches, and chemicals, typically lasting 15-20+ years with proper care. The finish bonds directly to the substrate, creating a tough protective layer.

**Laminate** offers good durability for impact and scratch resistance, particularly with high-pressure laminates. However, edges and corners are vulnerable to chipping, and water damage at seams can cause delamination. Generally lasts 10-15 years before showing wear.

### **Aesthetic Options**

**2-Pack Paint** provides unlimited color options with any paint shade achievable. You can create high-gloss, satin, or matte finishes with a seamless, uniform appearance. It's ideal for modern, minimalist designs without visible joints.

**Laminate** comes in extensive pre-made patterns including wood grains, stones, and solid colors. While the selection is vast, you're limited to manufacturer offerings. Visible seam lines at joints are unavoidable, though modern edge-banding has improved appearances.

### **Cost Considerations**

**2-Pack Paint** requires higher upfront investment—typically 30-50% more than laminate. Labor costs are significant due to multiple coats, drying time, and skilled application requirements. Budget \$150-250 per linear meter for quality work.

**Laminate** is more budget-friendly initially, costing roughly \$80-150 per linear meter installed. It's faster to install, reducing labor costs. Material waste is generally lower than painted finishes.

### **Maintenance and Repairs**

**2-Pack Paint** can be touched up or completely refinished if damaged, though color matching can be challenging. Minor scratches polish out easily. Deep damage requires professional repair but leaves no visible seams when done properly.

**Laminate** damage is harder to repair invisibly—chips and deep scratches typically require panel replacement. You can't refinish or change colors without complete replacement. However, daily cleaning is simple with just mild detergent.

### **Installation and Timeline**

**2-Pack Paint** needs controlled environment application with proper ventilation. The process takes 5-7 days including primer, base coats, and curing time. Off-gassing occurs during the first few weeks.

**Laminate** installs quickly—typically 2-3 days for an average kitchen. It's less sensitive to environmental conditions during installation with minimal fumes or odors.

### **Best Applications**

Choose **2-Pack Paint** for high-end projects where seamless aesthetics matter, when you need specific custom colors, or for unusual cabinet shapes that are difficult to laminate.

Choose **Laminate** for investment properties, budget-conscious projects, high-traffic commercial spaces, or when you want wood grain patterns that would be expensive to achieve with real timber.

The "better" choice depends on your specific priorities—2-pack paint excels in customization and repairability, while laminate wins on initial cost and installation speed.
